The 20th anniversary week went well! Thanks to all who participated!

The school will be implementing a new class schedule for next year to accommodate the WIN (What I Need) model. It will take place after lunch 2 days per week. Will initially use this time to teach the Mustang Pride expectations at the beginning of the year, then clubs and intervention time will follow. Testing data will be used to focus interventions. In the past, there have been students who did not have any elective periods due to the need for interventions. This will give those students a chance to have electives in addition to interventions. No instructional time will be lost - the extra minutes for WIN will come from the longer class period already in place for 1st period and the physical activity time at lunch. Students will get their required physical activity time in PE. Those who are enrolled in Health will have physical activity during their WIN time during that quarter. Scheduling WIN will make more activities available to students who can't stay after school due to the need for rides, etc. Teachers have been surveyed about the clubs they are willing to lead during WIN. Update on the recent Twitter posting by students from East Chapel Hill High School that has impacted our district:

Information was shared with teachers so that they could facilitate discussions in classrooms. A statement about human rights/human trafficking will be read during the play tonight. Several MMS programs and grade levels have or are planning specific response to the issues brought up by this event. Julie asked whether the curriculum will be reviewed and modified to better reflect our country's past regarding matters of race. The administration responded that MMS has not yet addressed the curriculum issues. There is a need to balance, guidance, and teacher preparation before implementing changes. Joann described an initiative that took place at McDougle Elementary School today to facilitate discussion about race and racial injustices. The initiative was designed by the school equity team. Debra will email the equity director, Sheldon Lanier, about our school's curriculum needs. The administration is looking for guiding questions, similar to the restorative practices model.

Social media awareness will be a big focus in the discussions that take place with students at the beginning of the next school year.

Debra will be working on updating the School Improvement Plan in May and June.
